#### After-school Clubs: A Look Back at the Year

Over the course of the school year, 11 clubs were held, reaching 374 children with the message of Christ. Out of those, 84 made professions of faith, thanks to the dedication of 58 faithful volunteers who served week after week.

In the coming years, we believe God is calling us to expand our reach and strengthen our impact. By 2026, our prayer is to share the Gospel with 2,000 children across the Panhandle. We are asking the Lord to open doors for at least two new afterschool Good News Clubs and to see 15 Five-Day Clubs® conducted by CYIA teens, who will also be equipped through training at South Plains College. We also hope to see growth in our seasonal ministries, adding two new Christmas Party Clubs and two new Easter Party Clubs by the end of 2026.

Looking further down the road, our vision for 2028 is even greater: 25 Good News Clubs shining brightly across our region and 25 Five-Day Clubs® spreading the Gospel into neighborhoods and communities. We know this will only be possible through faithful volunteers, passionate youth leaders and Donors with God's continued provision.

# What About the Reaching the Youth?

One of our deepest prayers for the near future is to develop a Junior Youth Challenge (JYC) Club — and see it planted in at least another location within our chapter. Teaching the JYC the" Go and Tell Series" to implement children reaching children. Imagine young children not only receiving the Gospel, but also reaching the Pre-teens in Middle Schools.

We are also seeking God's leading in potential collaborations with other ministries, believing that working together can create even more opportunities for children to hear about Jesus. And, as we move forward, we are preparing for a very special Vision Dinner in Amarillo, TX, a fundraiser that will allow us to share the future direction of CEF Panhandle with friends, supporters, and new partners.
